



# Fr. Mike's Message

Be merciful just as your Father is merciful...

Today's liturgy speaks to every one of us about life and what lies in our hearts, and how well we know our own hearts. As we live our lives we all deal with life as it comes at us. Sometimes we deal well with the problems we face and sometimes not so well. However we deal, we all do the best we can with what we know. That is not to say we cannot learn more about our relationships with one another and how better to cope with life; this is the message Our Lord is putting in front of us today. We being told in no mixed words to "be merciful, just as your Father is merciful."

In the first reading for today's liturgy we see David who has been unjustly condemned by King Saul reacting with that mercy and compassion Jesus speaks of. Saul who was consumed by jealousy of David's rising popularity has driven him out of the court and pursues him into the desert. When David had the opportunity to take the kings life, he chose not to because he was the anointed one. He spared Saul's life showing compassion and mercy. David did not allow his own feelings to guide his actions, rather he followed the mercy of God. How often in life do we all react from our emotions without thinking about what we are doing or saying. How often have we criticized or even condemned another because we didn't agree with them. It is way too easy to allow ourselves to be driven by emotions without any thought as to what might be right or merciful.

We are reminded by St. Paul that we all resemble Adam in the sense that we are created out of the earth with all of the faults and weaknesses we possess. And yet at the same time, we all resemble Christ because we have been formed in his image as well. The hard part is melding our humanity with the persona of Christ. This becomes the proverbial struggle, dealing with our emotions and remembering the law of Christ. Far too often in life we allow our anger, jealousy, insecurity, and judgmental attitudes to direct our lives without thinking about the consequences.

In the gospel for today Jesus emphasizes that forgiveness and love for one's enemies should be our guiding light. Judging from our standards, God's governance is not just. Equity, equality, democracy, and leadership are measured by a different value system in God's reign, and Jesus is asking us to make those standards our own. We cannot argue with the fact that forgiveness and acceptance is easy, but then again we expect people to enact those standards on us. It is far easier to be forgiven than to forgive others.

There is no doubt that as followers of Christ we are called to a higher standard of living, and this standard is not an easy one to embrace! It always gets down to our acceptance of things in life. We need to be aware of just how much we have been accepted and forgiven before we can start to do the same for others. If we do not feel forgiven, then we probably will not be so forgiving. It is always about the mercy and love of God that is in the forefront of all that life is about. When we remember that simple fact, maybe then it won't be so hard to follow after the teachings of Christ. We all need to make the command of Jesus a part of who we are and far more importantly who we are to become to "be merciful just as your Father is merciful."





# **Catholic Home Missions Collection**

On the First Sunday of Lent, which falls this year on March 9, our Diocese regularly conducts the Catholic Home Missions Appeal. We are asked to provide material support and spiritual aid to Dioceses in the United States and its territories that are unable to provide pastoral services without assistance from sources other than their own. We may be surprised to learn or to be reminded that 40% of the Dioceses in the United States are considered to be "home mission dioceses," that is, almost half of our Dioceses cannot support themselves without outside assistance. These Dioceses share several characteristics – small Catholic populations dispersed over a large geographical territory, economic challenges due to unemployment and migration, and diminishing populations due to members of the population leaving for urban areas. We may be asking ourselves – how is this situation different from our own? It is true that at various times our parishioners and other residents of the Diocese of Greensburg have struggled economically and financially, but we are still able to provide many basic services to the population of the Diocese of Greensburg. We are not dependent upon outside assistance, for which we offer our thanks to God! The Dioceses of the Home Missions in the United States have passionate and dedicated priests and deacons, consecrated religious brothers and sisters, and lay ministers who are eager to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. Yet they need our assistance in the face of financial hardships and other challenges. We can show our solidarity with our fellow Catholics in the United States through a generous sharing of our resources and prayers.
